



The following are a number of points which we presented during the congress entitled 'A Future which Unites Us' following an invitation by the leader of the Labour Party, Dr. Joseph Muscat.

We started our intervention by emphasising the importance of having 'a government that listens'. We went further to explain how humility is an underlying requirement of true listening.

We explained that as part of the movement we are in favour of governments that work in the national interest and for the common good rather than for a few private contacts.

We explained that we are in favour of governments that provide a long-term stable road map and not just within the planning perspective of winning the next election.

Governments that listen to the people throughout five years of a legislature – from the first day at office and not only before an election.

One of the main principles proposed was that a new government should adopt the principle that builds upon the good started by previous governments.

We explained that what is striking about Dr. Muscat is the fact that he is capable of acknowledging the good done by the present government, even though he is the leader of the opposition. We



support and commend his attitude which is capable of giving credit where it is due.

We concluded our intervention by explaining that we believe in this political movement and have hope that it will provide the political oxygen the country needs, in the interest of the nation and for the sake of democracy.
